TAKING ON THE VIKINGS COPENHAGEN MARATHON

These funds go towards another Inclusive Learning course diarised for 16 – 20 September – empowering more ECD educators in order to ensure the young children in their care have a brighter future.



TRAINING: EARLY LEARNING PROGRAM FOR 0 - 3 YEARS AND 3 - 5 YEARS

We are very proud of the 20 ECD principals and educators who graduated from our 6-month Early Learning Program training in June. Twenty training sessions were given and topics covered included playing with purpose, implementing a daily program that ensures holistic child development, inclusive learning, how to plan for a successful ELP, observations and solutions, administration and classroom management, practical incorporation of themes to ensure a lively, fun and engaging ELP, amongst others.

The ELP training courses included Resource Kits to ensure implementation of the program at the ECD Centres. 130 Mentorship visits to the ECD Centres also provided feedback opportunities and developmental guidance during implementation.

We are looking forward to the next 20 ECD Centres attending their Foundation Training and fortnightly ELP training in the second semester.





WASTE2TOYS

In April the Singakwenza Team hosted a Waste2Toys Workshop for 25 ECD Principals and practitioners. Masikhule focuses on using recycled or waste materials for ELP activities - so this really resonated with us!

The fun-filled morning was spent making a wide variety of toys and teaching materials from waste to improve:

- Gross and Fine Motor Skills
- Early Literacy and Numeracy
- Stages and types of play



ELDAS TRAINING

In June Anne Pedersen, one of our ECD team, facilitated an ELDAs training course for Funda Kunye in Hout Bay, whose Early Learning Program is also aligned with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) and its Early Learning Development Areas (ELDAs).

The ECD Centres greatly appreciated Anne's guidance with regards to the understanding and implementation of these principles.

- Allow children to experience joy, fascination, and curiosity through exploration
- Develop vocabulary, language, literacy and mathematics skills.







Music To All Ears!

Our huge thanks to Erinvale Eagles for a wonderful donation that allowed us to provide music kits for our Early Learning Resource Library and a number of ECD Centres.

New research shows that making music has even more developmental benefits than simply listening to music. This is one of the reasons why it's so beneficial for children to experiment with musical instruments. More specifically, allowing them to play percussion instruments — those that are hit, scratched, shaken or tapped can be incredibly valuable to their development.

We created fun music activity posters and spent time training the ECD educators to ensure maximum use and benefit.



Our online program - **MASKOT** - continues to grow and add value, not only to the early learning of young children, but also to the depth and quality of teaching of their educators and caregivers.

The number of users has grown to over 440, with many new users from a variety of provinces, professions and organisations.
